Heroin Trafficking - Trends



Latest Trends

In Drug Trafficking

Heroin and hashish are the two main drugs which are being trafficked to the world markets, especially Europe and USA. Heroin smuggling is more lucrative because of high profit rates. The traffickers use highly innovative but innocuous looking methods for concealment of heroin.

In the succeding pages some of the more uncommon but innovative concealment methods are shown to familiarize the law inforcement officers for effective interdiction.

Heroin Concealed in Flour Mills

30 kgs heroin was found concealed into ten cemented flour mills. Heroin was wrapped in polythene bags and was hidden inside flour stone.



Heroin Concealed in Laptop

1.350 kgs heroin was concealed behind the screen monitor of a laptop computer and its charger. Interestingly, the computer was functional when it was intercepted.



Heroin Concealed in Cosmetics

860 grams heroin concealed in different cosmetic items and dry batteries was recovered.



Heroin Concealed in Kneading Machine

A passenger carrying flour Kneader was intercepted and 3 kgs heroin was recovered from the false cavities of the machine.



Heroin Concealed in Sweet Box

Fifty three capsules containing 500 grams heroin were mixed with sweets which were destined to Uganda.



Heroin Concealed in Suitcases

Concealment of heroin in different cavities of suitcases. A total of fifty one cases were detected and 139 Kgs heroin was seized from suitcases during year 2007.



Heroin Concealed in Hair Clips

I kgs and 7 kgs heroin was recovered in two different cases but of similar nature. In both cases, heroin was concealed in hair clips.



Heroin Filled Capsules

Like previous years, ingested heroin filled capsules remained the most common method of heroin trafficking and about 106 kgs heroin was recovered from capsules in One hundred and twenty five different cases.



Heroin Concealed in Pistons

4 kgs heroin was recovered from pistons of vehicle at Peshawar. A total of nine pistons were recovered from three different cartons, which all contained heroin filled polythene bags.



Heroin Concealed in Mangoes

52 kgs of heroin was tactfully concealed in the bases of cartons. Each carton had four to five mangoes. The consignment was intercepted at cargo office Islamabad Airport, which was destined to South Africa.



Heroin Concealed in Tin Packs

An African was apprehended at Faisalabad Airport with 6.5 kgs heroin. Heroin filled capsules were mixed with ordinary capsules in thirty tins, which were labeled as "Oxytetracycline dehydrate".



Cocaine in Rugs

4.5 kgs Cocaine soaked in woolen tapestries was seized at Allama Iqbal International Airport Lahore, which had arrived from Lima, Peru.



Hashish in Motor Oil Tin

52 Kgs hashish was recovered from sixteen gallons of motor oil at Peshawar.



Heroin Concealed in Walnuts

Three sacks of walnuts, each sack weighing approximately 40 kgs were seized at Peshawar. Search revealed some walnuts in only one of the sack had heroin wrapped in small polythene bags very carefully concealed inside the walnut. 1.360 kgs of heroin was recovered from the walnuts.



Heroin Concealed in Dinner Set

A dinner set was intercepted at Lahore which had 580 grams of heroin concealed in the base of plates.



Heroin Wrapped around the Legs

A passenger at Lahore Airport was arrested who had 3 kgs of heroin wrapped around his legs and covered with medical dressing.





Review Report



RD Karachi

Sindh has the proud privilege of being the first recipient of Islam in South Asia. Its cultural heritage, therefore, depicts the tenants of Islam. After independence, Sindhi literature has been enriched with new ideas taken from Urdu and Sindhi. In Sindh, people from northern and southern India have also been settled after independence which is the cause of diversity in culture.

The province of Sindh derives its name from River Sindhu, the Indus. The total area of Sindh is 140,914 Sq Km. The Sindh plain comprises mainly the province of Sindh. It is a huge piece of land stretched in between the Arabian Sea and the Punjab plain. River Indus flows through these plains. Towards the East of the River is a sandy belt stretching right from Bahawalpur to the Rann of Katch known as the Thar Desert. Indus River terminates in the deltaic area of Thatta District. According to the preliminary results of the 1998 census, the population of Sindh is approximately 30 million out of which 45% is urban and 55% is rural.


Organizational Structure

Major Seizures.

On January 5, staff of ANF Police Station Muhammad Ali Society, Karachi arrested one suspect at Jinnah International Airport, who was proceeding to Milan (Italy) and recovered II kgs heroin which was concealed in a suitcase.



On January 8, ANF Police Station Muhammad Ali Society, Karachi arrested one person from Medicine Market Kachi Gali, Denso hall, Karachi and recovered 12980 Neomycin Sulphate tablets and 20000 Norgesic tablets (Psychotropic Substance), which was brought by the accused from Cairo for selling at Karachi.

On January 16,ANF Police Station Regional Directorate, Karachi received information and conducted a raid near Bar B.Q Tonight, Clifton, Karachi, arrested one accused person and recovered **85 kgs heroin** which was packed in cover of a quilt, kept in a Jeep.

On January 25, staff of ANF Police Station Muhammad Ali Society, Karachi arrested a suspected person at Jinnah International Airport, who reached from New York (USA) and recovered **0.225 kg cocaine** from his possession which was concealed in plastic bag in the shape of chocolate.

On January 31, ANF Police Station Regional Directorate, Karachi conducted a raid near Oases Garden, Naveed State Agency, Karachi, arrested one accused person and recovered **30 kgs heroin** which was concealed inside 10 cemented mills (Chakki).



On February 16, a raid was conducted in house No A-64 Tariq Bin Zayad Colony Malir Halt Karachi and 301 kgs heroin was recovered from two rooms concealed in hand bags along with two accused persons.



On March 6, staff of ANF Police Station Regional Directorate, Karachi arrested one suspected lady at Jinnah International Airport, who was proceeding to Milan and recovered 6 kgs heroin which was concealed in secret cavities of her suitcase.



On June 9, staff of ANF Police Station Sukkur arrested two accused persons and recovered 385 kgs hashish.



On June 28, staff of ANF Police Station Muhammad Ali Society, Karachi arrested one accused person at Jinnah International Airport, who was proceeding to Lagos via Dubai and recovered 5 kgs heroin which was concealed in the secret cavities of a trolley bag.



On July 6, during checking of the cargo at Cargo Terminal Jinnah International Airport Karachi, staff of ANF Police Station Muhammad Ali Society seized a parcel which was checked and 60,000 tablets Valium (Diazepam), 22,400 tablets Dormicum (Midazolam and 350 tablets Stilnox (Zolpiden) were recovered.

On July 23, staff of ANF Police Station Gulshan-e-Iqbal, Karachi conducted a raid near Al-Asif Square Sohrab Goth, Karachi, arrested three accused persons and recovered **173 kgs hashish** from secret cavities made in the floor of a bus.

On August 2, during checking of cargo at Cargo Terminal Jinnah International Airport Karachi, staff of ANF Police Station Muhammad Ali Society seized 2 parcels containing **30380 tables and 100 capsules of psychotropic substances drugs** booked for USA by various persons through different post offices.

On August 23, staff of ANF Police Regional Directorate, Karachi arrested two accused ladies at Jinnah International Airport Karachi and recovered **7 kgs heroin** from their personal possession which was concealed in secret cavities of 2520 hair clips.



On November 16, staff of ANF Police Station Regional Directorate, Karachi conducted a raid near Bismillah Market, New Subzi Mandi, Super High Way, Karachi and arrested an accused person and recovered **20 kgs heroin** from his possession which was kept in a motor cab.



On November 29, operational manager head office TNT Karachi informed that a suspicious consignment (9 hand made carpets) was booked for London. The consignment was intercepted by PS ANF Muhammad Ali Society and **5.400 kgs heroin** was recovered from the consignment.





Assets Investigation

The Assets Investigation branch started functioning in 1994 in light of the government's decision to initiate assets investigation against drug barons, who had acquired the assets/properties through drug proceeds. Earlier this agency was only making efforts to curb the drug smuggling and arrest the drug barons. Initially no separate assets branch was set up, however some assets investigation was carried out by the intelligence branch. Presently assets investigation is being carried out as a special task and drug smugglers who have acquired assets through drug proceeds are being put behind the bar. Special attention is being extended to the prosecution of assets cases, so that the forfeiture may be achieved in most cases.

Hajj Operation

Hajj operation 2007 commenced on 13 Nov 2007 and was completed on 14 Dec 2007. ANF deputed four detachments, at Hajji Camp Karachi, Hajj Terminal-III Karachi and at Sukkur Airport. During this operation, 163 flights consisting 48,281 passengers destined to Saudi Arabia were checked. Necessary coordination with all Agencies and Hajj Directorate was made well before commencement of operation for smooth functioning. Special emphasis was given to ensure smooth and uninterrupted flow of pilgrims for Hajj, and the highlights of the operation were:-

- Banners containing anti drug messages were displayed at Hajj terminal and Hajji camp Karachi.
- PTV and other private channel were approached to contribute by telecasting special programmes against drug abuse and trafficking besides other aspects of Hajj.
- Leaflets/booklets and pamphlets, containing guidance for pilgrims on drug awareness and repercussions of drug trafficking were distributed.
- Special announcements on public address system, were made against drug smuggling highlighting death penalty in Saudi Arabia.
- Stickers were pasted on each piece of baggage which were signed both by ANF and Custom staff to confirm thorough checking of luggage.

Due to strict vigilance and efforts made by ANF and other agencies, no drug case was detected at Karachi and Sukkur Airports.

Major Seizures

On January 17, on information, staff of Police Station ANF Lahore intercepted a motorcycle at Saranki Road, Kasur, leading to arrest of two persons besides recovery of **25 kgs hashish**, arms and ammunition. On pointation of an accused, a further raid was conducted at his house leading to further recovery of **75 kgs hashish**. Total recovery in this case is **100 kgs hashish**.

On January 18, PS ANF Multan conducted a raid at a house situated in Basti Sher Khan, District Muzaffargarh and apprehended two persons besides recovery of **160 kgs hashish**.

On February 28, PS ANF Faisalabad intercepted a trailer near NLC Det, District Bhakar and arrested one person besides recovery of **90 kgs garda hashish** from the trailer.

On March 18, PS ANF Lahore Airport staff apprehended a Pakistani national who was proceeding to Lagos (Nigeria). Thorough search of luggage led to recovery of 13 kgs heroin cleverly concealed in his suitcase. He was arrested on the spot.

On March 20, Acting on source information, PS ANF Lahore intercepted 2 Cars at Gujrat Bypass, Gujrat and arrested 6 persons besides recovery of **30 kgs heroin**, arms and ammunition from the cars.

On March 21, staff of Police Station ANF Lahore intercepted a car near Ittifaq Hosptial, Model Town, Lahore and arrested a Nigerian national besides recovery of **3 kgs heroin**. On his pointation a further raid was conducted at H # 10, Lawrence Road, Lahore and arrested four more Nigerians besides further recovery of **2 kgs heroin** along with packing material. Total recovery in this case is **5 kgs heroin**.

On April 25, on prior information, ANF Faisalabad Airport staff intercepted a Nigerian national who was proceeding to Conakry. Thorough search of his suitcase led to recovery of **6.5 kgs heroin** concealed in capsules. He was arrested at the spot.

On May 5, staff of Police Station ANF Lahore conducted a raid at Village Bongha Balochan, district Kasur and arrested two persons besides recovery of **120 kgs hashish**, from their personal possession.

On May 25, staff of Police Station ANF Lahore intercepted a suspicious motorcycle at Shahdara Chowk, Lahore. On information of the bike rider, the staff of ANF raided a house situated at Shahdara, Lahore. This led to arrest of two persons besides recovery of **3 kgs heroin**, fake currency, arms and ammunition from their possession.

On June 26, staff of Police Station ANF Lahore intercepted two motorcycles at Baqapur Adda, district Kasur and further raided a house situated in village Bhagiwal Tibba, district Kasur. This led to apprehension of four persons besides recovery of **300 kgs hashish, 1.110 kgs opium**, fake currency and arms and ammunition.

On July 12, ANF Lahore Airport staff, intercepted a Filipino woman who was proceeding to Manila. Thorough search of her luggage led to the recovery of **4 kgs heroin** concealed in her vanity box and suitcase. She was arrested on the spot.



On July 23, staff of Police Station ANF Faisalabad intercepted a motorcycle near General Bus Stand, Faisalabad. On information of the bike rider, the staff of ANF further raided near PSO Petrol Pump, Ghulam Muhammadabad, Faisalabad. This led to arrest of one person besides recovery of **97 kgs hashish, 40 kgs opium and 1 kg heroin**.

On August 7, ANF Lahore Airport staff intercepted a consignment containing 9 Rugs (Wool Tapestries), which was being imported from Lima, Peru. This led to arrest of two persons besides recovery of 2.5 kgs cocaine which was pasted with glue at the back of the rugs.



On September 6, ANF Lahore Airport staff apprehended two Pakistani nationals. Thorough body search of one of the accused, who was proceeding to Kuala Lumpur, led to the recovery of **3 kgs heroin** wrapped around his legs. He was arrested on the spot.



On September 16, staff of Police Station ANF Lahore, intercepted a car at Kareem Park, Lahore and apprehended two women besides recovery of 107 kgs hashish.



On September 27, on information staff of Police Station ANF Lahore conducted a raid at Village Arayan, Lahore and arrested four persons besides recovery of 12 kgs heroin, 77 kgs hashish and 7 kgs opium.



On October 24, ANF Lahore Airport staff recovered three packets lying in the duct adjacent to the bathrooms of International Departure Lounge, Lahore containing 4 kgs heroin.



On November 16, ANF Lahore Airport staff checked a suspected packet lying in the washroom of International Departure Lounge, which led to the recovery of **5 kgs heroin** concealed in 2 leg pads and a belt.



On November 23, staff of Police Station ANF Faisalabad raided house number 619, Mohallah Sohailabad, Faisalabad and arrested five persons besides recovery of 175 kgs Acetic Anhydride.

On November 28, staff of Police Station ANF Lahore checked a suspected bag lying in Expo Centre Ground, Johar Town, Lahore which led to recovery of **6 kgs heroin**.

On December 8, staff of Police Station ANF Multan intercepted a motorcycle leading to arrest of two persons besides recovery of drugs. On their information a further raid was conducted at the house of one of the accused. This led to further recovery of drugs Total recovery in this case was 5 kgs heroin, 7.5 kgs opium and 1 kg hashish garda.

On December 26, staff of Police Station ANF Lahore intercepted 2 cars at Chan Da Qila, G.T. Road, Gujranwala and arrested two persons besides recovery of **10 kgs heroin**, along with liquor and arms.

On December 27, staff of Police Station ANF Multan conducted a raid at Sher Shah Road, opposite UBL Bank, Ismailabad Branch, Multan and recovered **210 kgs hashish** buried under ground in a deserted area.

Hajj Operation:

Comprehensive awareness campaign was launched during Hajj operation, which produced excellent results. Hajj operation started in Punjab from November 13 and concluded on December 14. In the year 2007, 137 PIA flights were operated from Lahore, Multan and Faisalabad simultaneously, in which 40406 pilgrims traveled. The pilgrims who traveled through Saudi Airlines flights were 4955 in number, operated from Allama Iqbal International Airport Lahore. Following awareness activities were undertaken:

- Banners against drug trafficking to Saudi Arabia were displayed at Haji Camp, Hajj Terminal and International Departure Lounge, for creating awareness among the pilgrims.
- Mega size posters showing death punishment for using and trafficking drugs in Saudi Arabia were fixed in Haji Camp, Hajj Terminal, International Departure Lounge and living rooms of pilgrims at Haji Camp Lahore.
- Hand bills carrying instructions and cautions against illegal trafficking of drugs were distributed among pilgrims.
- Announcements were regularly made through Public Address System at Haji Camp cautioning the pilgrims about illegal trafficking of drugs.
- To deter potential drug traffickers, a large hoarding board showing death punishment in Saudi Arabia was fixed at the main gate of Haji camp.
- Wall chalking on the outer wall of Haji camp with slogans against drug trafficking to Saudi Arabia, was done.
- Stickers with anti drug slogans were pasted on each piece of baggage.
- Movies showing consequences of drug trafficking to Kingdom of Saudi Arabia were screened in departure lounge for every Hajj flight.
- Frequent announcements against drug trafficking were made through a mobile Van in Lahore city to create awareness among pilgrims. The Van also displayed banners with anti drug slogans.










Review Report



RD Peshawar

Regional Directorate North West Frontier Province (NWFP) has earned a reputation for diligence and efficiency. An objective assessment of the results produced in various fields such as Interdiction, Prosecution, Demand Reduction and Assets Investigation/Forfeiture etcetera are a testimony to the organization's result oriented performance. However, there is a definite need to step up efforts to produce better results in the year 2008.

North West Frontier Province (NWFP) is a hard hit province vulnerable to narco-trade due to its geographical position and rough terrain. The tribal belt provides a safe haven to the drug smugglers resulting in drug trafficking to the settled districts of NWFP, Punjab, Sindh and abroad. Heroin is smuggled from Afghanistan while hashish is produced locally. Ever since the deployment of Army and Frontier Corps on Pak - Afghan border for surveillance and security duties, the flow of heroin trafficking from Afghanistan has reduced to an extent. However, the border being long and porous has many unfrequented routes through the rugged mountainous areas which are used by the smugglers.

Major Seizures.

On January 9, on information staff of Police Station ANF Peshawar intercepted a Suzuki Cultus motor car, at Jamrud road, Peshawar and recovered 117 kgs hashish from its secret cavities. Two accused persons traveling in the same car were arrested.



On January 10, on prior information staff of Police Station ANF Peshawar intercepted a Honda Civic motor car, at Jamrud road, Peshawar and recovered **287 kgs of hashish, 3 kgs of opium** from its secret cavities. The accused driver of the car was arrested on the spot.



On January 13 on prior information staff of Police Station ANF Peshawar intercepted a Toyota Corolla motor car at Jamrud road Peshawar and recovered 473 kgs of hashish, 8 kgs of opium, arms and ammunition. The accused driver of the car was arrested.



n January 15, on information staff of Police Station ANF Kohat intercepted a truck at Kohat – Pindi road and recovered **185 kgs hashish and 25 kgs opium** from its secret cavities. Two accused persons were arrested on the spot.

On January 23, on prior information, staff of Police Station ANF Peshawar intercepted a Honda city motor car at GT road Nowshera and recovered **512 kgs hashish and 8 kgs opium** from its secret cavities. Two accused persons traveling in the same car were arrested.

On January 23, on information, staff of Police Station ANF Kohat intercepted a bus at Indus Highway Kohat and recovered **105 kgs hashish** from its secret cavities. The accused driver was arrested on the spot.

On February I, on information, staff of Police Station ANF Peshawar intercepted a Honda Cifty motor car at Jamrud road Peshawar and recovered **433 kgs hashish**, **6 kgs opium**, arms and ammunition from its secret cavities.n Two accused persons traveling in the same car were arrested.

On February 8, on information, ANF staff posted at Peshawar airport intercepted a Nigerian national. During search of his luggage 4 kgs of heroin was recovered which was concealed in his suitcase. He was arrested on the spot and on his pointation another Nigerian national was also arrested from G-8, Islamabad.



On February 17, on information staff of Police Station ANF Kohat intercepted a truck at Indus Highway Kohat and recovered **178 kgs hashish and 23 kgs opium** from its secret cavities. An accused person was arrested on the spot.

On March 19, on prior information, a South African national was intercepted by ANF staff posted at Peshawar Airport. During the search of his luggage **3 kgs heroin** was recovered from his bag. He was arrested on the spot.



On March 20, on information, staff of Police Station ANF Kohat laid a picket at Indus Highway and intercepted a Karachi bound bus. During the search **166 kgs hashish and 7 kgs opium** were recovered from the secret cavities of the bus. An accused passenger was arrested on the spot.

On March 20 on prior information, staff of Police Station ANF Kohat intercepted a truck at Kohat - Pindi road and recovered **260 kgs hashish and 50 kgs opium** from its secret cavities. Two accused persons were arrested on the spot.

On May 11, on information staff of Police Station ANF Peshawar laid a picket at Jamrud road Peshawar. During search of an accused person **7 kgs heroin** was recovered from his hand bag. He was arrested on the spot.

On May 16, on prior information, staff of Police Station ANF Peshawar intercepted a Suzuki Mehran motorcar at Peshawar-Kohat road. During checking of the same 15 kgs heroin was recovered. The accused driver was arrested on the spot.

May 21 staff of Police Station ANF Kohat intercepted a Suzuki van at Indus Highway (Kohat). During search **236 kgs hashish and 4 kgs opium** were recovered from specially built cavities in floor and roof of the Suzuki van. Four accused persons traveling in the same car were arrested.

On June 4, acting on a tip off, ANF staff posted at Peshawar airport, intercepted a China bound Pakistani national. During the search of his luggage 8 kgs heroin was recovered from his suitcase. He was arrested on the spot.

On June 15, on prior information, staff of Police Station ANF Peshawar intercepted a motorcar at Jamrud road Peshawar and recovered **310 kgs hashish and 3 kgs opium.** The accused driver managed to escape due to dense traffic.



On June 19, on information, staff of Police Station ANF Kohat intercepted a Suzuki car at Kohat - Pindi road. During search **20 kgs heroin** was recovered from a bag lying on back seat of the car. Two accused persons traveling in the same car were arrested.

On June 29 on prior information staff of Police Station ANF Kohat intercepted a Toyota Corolla motorcar. During search **6 kgs heroin** was recovered from its secret cavities. The accused driver was arrested on the spot.

On July 28, on prior information, ANF Peshawar Airport detachment intercepted a Paris bound Bulgarian family. During the search of the luggage **9 kgs heroin** concealed in a trolley bag was recovered. The accused Bulgarian woman and her husband were arrested.

On August 4 staff of Police Station ANF Peshawar intercepted a Ford Wagon at GT road Peshawar. During the search **202 kgs hashish and 22 kgs opium** were recovered from the secret cavities of the Wagon. The driver of the wagon was arrested on the spot.

On August 10, staff of Police Station ANF Peshawar intercepted a Toyota Corolla motorcar at Jamrud road Peshawar. During search **6 kgs heroin** was recovered from its secret cavities. The accused driver was arrested on the spot.

On August 12, on information, staff of ANF Peshawar Airport detachment intercepted a consignment of fresh vegetables, being sent to Dubai. During the search **9 kgs heroin** was recovered concealed in 48 cartons. Shippers of the consignment absconded.



On August 14, staff of Police Station ANF Peshawar intercepted a Suzuki jeep at Jamrud road Peshawar. During search **242 kgs hashish**, **30 kgs opium** were recovered along with arms and ammunition. Three accused persons traveling in the same jeep were arrested.

On August 29, on prior information staff of Police Station ANF Peshawar intercepted a Pick Up at Jamrud road Peshawar. During search **293 kgs hashish, 6 kgs opium** were recovered along with ammunition from its secret cavities. An accused person was arrested on the spot.

On September 4, on information, staff of Police Station ANF Peshawar recovered **4 kgs heroin**, from the personal possession of a Nigerian national. Heroin was concealed in machinery parts. He was arrested on the spot.



On September 10, ANF Peshawar Airport detachment intercepted a South African national. During the search of his luggage 4 kgs heroin, concealed in a carton of dinner set, was recovered. He was arrested on the spot.



On September 14, staff of Police Station ANF Peshawar intercepted a Honda City motorcar at GT Road Peshawar. During the search **156 kgs hashish** was recovered from the secret cavities of the motorcar. An accused person was arrested on the spot.

On September 22, on information, staff of Police Station ANF Kohat intercepted a Daewoo motorcar at Indus Highway near Kohat Tunnel. During the search of motorcar 10 kgs heroin and 2 kgs opium were recovered from its secret cavities. Two accused persons were arrested on the spot.

On September 24, staff of Police Station ANF Kohat intercepted a Karachi bound bus at Indus Highway Kohat. During the search 13 kgs heroin was recovered from three accused persons. The drug was concealed in sandals, personal luggage and wrapped around the bodies of the accused persons who were arrested on the spot.



On October I, ANF Peshawar Airport detachment intercepted a Thai woman bound for Bangkok. During the search **4 kgs heroin** was recovered concealed in secret cavities of her suitcase. She was arrested on the spot.



On October 2, staff of ANF Police Station Peshawar Intercepted a Suzuki motorcar at Nowshera-Mardan road Nowshera. During the search **4 kgs heroin** was recovered, concealed in front doors of the vehicle. Two accused persons traveling in the same car were arrested.

On October 19, staff of Police Station ANF Peshawar intercepted a person near a bus stand at Peshawar- Kohat road. During the search 1 kgs cocaine was recovered from personal possession of the accused person who was arrested on the spot.

On October 25, staff of Police Station ANF Peshawar intercepted a motorcar at Bara road Peshawar. During the search of the motorcar **30 kgs heroin and 5 kgs hashish** were recovered from its secret cavities. The accused driver was arrested on the spot.

On November 11, staff of Police Station ANF Kohat intercepted a Bedford truck at Indus Highway Kohat. During the search of the truck **214 kgs hashish and 7 kgs opium** were recovered from its secret cavities. An accused person was arrested on the spot.


On November 13, staff of Police Station ANF Peshawar intercepted a Bedford truck at GT road near Khairabad. During the search of the truck 181 kgs hashish and 0.400 kgs opium were recovered from its secret cavities. An accused person was arrested on the spot.



On November 18, on prior information staff of Police Station ANF Peshawar raided a house in Hayatabad, Peshawar. During the search of the house 144 kgs hashish, 2 kgs heroin along with arms and ammunition were recovered. The drugs and arms were concealed in sides of empty 116 cartons. Three accused persons were arrested on the spot.

On November 21, staff of Police Station ANF Kohat intercepted a truck at Indus Highway Kohat. During the search of the truck **149 kgs hashish** was recovered from its secret cavities and a spare tyre. The accused driver was arrested on the spot.





Assets Investigation

The assets branch plays a vital role in seizing property acquired through drug proceeds. Action is taken under the legal provisions of the Prevention of Smuggling Act 1977 or the Control of Narcotics Substances Act 1977. Moreover the Regional Directorate ANF Peshawar also assists other Regional Directorates in conducting assets inquiries against individuals belonging to NWFP.

The Assets Branch of Regional Directorate, NWFP vigorously pursued the pending assets inquiries and took up the cases to freeze the traced assets of drug barons. Due to the efforts of the Assets Branch, assets worth approximately 70 millions rupees were frozen in three high profile cases.

Poppy Cultivation and Destruction:

Historically poppy crop was grown in Pakistan for a long time before partition. However, production of opium from poppy growing areas in Pakistan ranged from 200 to 250 tons around 1947. The traditional poppy growing areas were Dir, Buner, Swat, Swabi, Haripur and Kala Dhaka in NWFP and Bajaur, Mohmand and Khyber Agencies in FATA. Initially poppy was grown only in traditional areas which were also brought down to zero level in 2000/2001 through various incentives and stringent administrative measures. After the fall of Taliban, in year 2002/2003 resurgence of poppy was seen not only in traditional poppy growing areas but was also introduced in non-traditional poppy growing areas namely district Kohistan, de facto areas of Peshawar and Charsadda districts, tribal areas, Kurram, Orakzai, North and South Waziristan Agencies.

Reasons for Resurgence

- Delayed execution of development works already promised and disruption in flow of aid/ grants.
- Growing interest of Afghans in the area due to internal strife in Afghanistan.
- Commitment of law enforcement agencies in counter terrorism operations i.e. shift in focus from anti narcotics to anti terrorism.
- Drought like condition (for alternative crops).
- Decree passed by local clerics in favour of poppy growers.

The Drug Demand Reduction section of ANF NWFP remained very active during 2007 and carried out various other activities for drug abuse prevention, treatment and rehabilitation:-

- ANF NWFP carried out a programme to educate Teachers and Students against Drug Abuse in
 73 Government & Private High Schools of districts Abbottabad and Kohat. Total 8300 students
 and 272 teachers directly benefited from this programme.
- A seminar was origanized by ANF at Khushal Khan Library Akora Khattak to educate nazims, teachers and students of district Nowshera against Drug Abuse.

- A seminar was arranged by ANF for community representatives of district Mardan. More then 200 community leaders attended this seminar.
- Anti Narcotics Force NWFP organized a four days All NWFP ANF Volleyball tournament at Bannu.
- A Cricket Tournament was organized by Anti Narcotics Force NWFP at Tatara Ground Landi Kotal, Khyber Agency. 26 x teams from all over Khyber agency participated in the tournament. ANF messages were communicated to masses through running commentary and banners displayed around the ground.
- Mass Awareness Against drug abuse through cycle rally from Balochistan to Peshawar and then Rawalpindi was arranged by ANF & Roshan Mustaqbal Social Welfare Cycling Society Balochistan. The cyclists visited different parts of NWFP and conveyed anti drug messages to the people.
- Anti Narcotics Force arranged a District level speech competition at Mardan for the students of class 9 and 10 of Tehsil Mardan and Takhtbai.
- Three days Provincial Table Tennis Tournament was organized. 150 players from Peshawar district and total 200 players participated from all over the NWFP.
- One day seminar and a unique Happy Funeral (Cigarette Burial Ceremony) was arranged at Bannu. Funeral ceremony was arranged in a traditional manner, to attract local population.
- Mr & Mr Junior Pakistan National Body Building Contest 2007 was arranged at Peshawar. More than 200 body builders from NWFP, Punjab, Sindh, Balochistan, Army, Navy, Police, WAPDA, Railway and FATA participated in the event. Anti Drug Abuse messages were displayed.

Hajj Operation 2007

The Hajj Operation 2007 commenced on November 11 and terminated on December 15. Total 23876 Hajj pilgrims were airlifted from Peshawar International Airport during Hajj session 2007. Vigilance of ANF staff and other related agencies contributed positively towards drug free flights to Saudi Arabia during Hajj operation 2007. Awareness regarding narcotics trafficking was widely created by displaying Panaflex banners both inside & outside the Hajj complex, Peshawar city & cantonment and en route Hajj Complex. Booklets and key chains were distributed among the pilgrims. Anti drug messages were announced in Urdu and Pushto, at Hajj complex, to create awareness among pilgrims.

Review Report



RD Quetta

We are hopeful that our efforts will bear fruit and will positively contribute towards achieving our ANF objective of drug free Pakistan.


Orgnizational Structure

Major Seizures.

On January 24, ANF Combat Team Dalbandin received information that some smugglers have dumped a huge quantity of drugs in general area Kharan Desert near Dostin Wadh. A raid was conducted on the suspected site, which resulted into recovery of **1820 kgs hashish.**

On April 6, ANF Police Station Quetta received information that a huge quantity of drugs would be smuggled from Afghanistan to Quetta via Pishin. The suspected area was cordoned off and search carried out. During the search, **390 kgs of opium** was recovered loaded on 3 donkeys.

On April 16, ANF Combat Team Turbat received information that drug smugglers have dumped a huge quantity of narcotics in general area Jallabar district Kech. A raiding party was despatched to the suspected site. The culprits managed to escape taking advantage of darkness. Thorough search of the area was carried out which resulted in recovery of 1000 kgs hashish.

On May 19,ANF Police Station Turbat received information that some smugglers intend to smuggle a huge quantity of drugs through a vehicle from Afghanistan to Iran via Buleda Cross. A combat team was despatched to Chob Shatab district Kech, which established a check post on Buleda Cross. During exchange of fire, drug smugglers managed to escape leaving a vehicle behind. The vehicle was searched and 127 kgs opium and 23 kgs hashish were recovered.

On May 24, combat team Police Station Turbat raided a house in Quetta Bazar, district Kech and recovered 210 kgs hashish and 70 kgs opium. A Toyota double cabin, a Pajero jeep and a motorcycle were also seized. One person was arrested on the spot.

On May 24, Regional Directorate ANF Quetta on receiving information despatched a combat team to the general area Nalab district Chagai and recovered 1767 kgs morphine.

On May 27, Regional Directorate ANF Quetta on receiving information despatched a combat team to the general area Garmakan district Panjgur and recovered **1000 kgs opium** along with a Toyota Hilux and a cache of arms. Four persons were also arrested on the spot.

On July 18, on the information of Special Investigation Cell (SIC) Quetta a combat team of Regional Directorate ANF Quetta established a check post at Quetta - Karachi Road near Lakpass and intercepted a Turbat bounded bus. On thorough search, 298 kgs opium was recovered from hidden cavities of the bus. Two persons were also arrested.



On June 19, Police Station ANF Panjgur on receiving information despatched a combat team to Bonustan district Panjgur and recovered **350 kgs hashish.**

On July 18, Regional Directorate ANF Quetta received information that some drug traffickers have dumped a huge consignment of drugs in general area Killi Gaz district Mastung. A combat team cordoned off the area and carried out a search operation. During search 511 kgs opium was recovered. The culprits managed to escape after seeing the ANF vehicles.

On July 25, on the information of SIC Quetta a combat team Regional Directorate ANF Quetta established a check post at Quetta - Sibi Road near Spizend and intercepted a suspected truck. On thorough search, **261 kgs opium** was recovered from the truck. Three persons were also arrested.



On August 7, on info of SIC Quetta, a combat team PS ANF Turbat raided an orchard in general area Balicha district Kech and recovered 10 kgs heroin. No arrest could be made at the spot.

On August 11, Police Station ANF Panigur on receiving information despatched a combat team to Click Rukhshan Nullah, district Panigur. On thorough search of the area **325 kgs hashish** was recovered.

On September 23, Regional Directorate ANF Balochistan on receiving information despatched a combat team to general area Bostan district Pishin and recovered **786 kgs opium** after detailed search of the area.



On September 28,ANF Combat Team Dalbandin on receiving information conducted a raid in general area Killi Shahdien Girdi Jungle district Chagai which resulted in recovery of **540 kgs opium.**

On November 10, Police Station ANF Dalbandin on receiving information despatched a combat team to general area Dasht Goran district Chagai. On thorough search of the area **50 kgs morphine** was recovered.

On November 11, Regional Directorate ANF Quetta on the tip-off raided the site in general area Mizai Adda, district Qilla Abdullah and recovered 1202 kgs opium. The culprits managed to flee away taking advantage of darkness.



On November 14, Regional Directorate ANF

Balochistan on the tip-off raided the site in general area Smungli Road, Quetta and recovered 592 kgs opium.

On November 29, Regional Directorate ANF Quetta on receiving information cordoned off the general area Alizai, District Pishin. During the search **3034 kgs opium** was recovered from the foot hill of a mountain.

On December 4, on the information of SIC Quetta a combat team Regional Directorate ANF Quetta established a check post at Quetta – Chaman road and intercepted a suspected truck. During the thorough search **I 19 kgs opium** was recovered from the hidden cavities. One accused person was arrested.

On December 4, on the information of SIC Quetta, a combat team of Regional Directorate ANF Quetta raided a house at Satellite Town Quetta and recovered **450 litres of Acetic Anhydride Chemical.** One accused person was arrested.

On December 8, a combat team Police Station ANF Turbat carried out operation in general area Kalatuk district Kech and recovered **80 kgs opium and 30 kgs hashish** along with ammunition.

On December 10, a combat team Police Station ANF Dalbandin carried out operation in general area Chagai and recovered **225 kgs hashish.**

On December 25, on the information of SIC Quetta, a combat team of Regional Directorate ANF Quetta carried out operation in general area Kuchlak district Quetta. 10 kgs heroin and 50 kg hashish was recovered from a Suzuki car.



On December 26, on receiving information a combat team of Police Station ANF Dalbandin, raided the site in general area Gulsher Dana district Chagai and recovered **960 kgs hashish.**

Poppy Cultivation and Destruction:

Like previous years, Regional Directorate ANF Quetta carried out poppy eradication campaign in year 2006/2007 in which 1028 acres of poppy cultivated fields were destroyed. Besides this 28 Peter Generators were destroyed while 4 Peter Generators were seized. 26 acres poppy was destroyed voluntarily by villagers. 32 FIRs were lodged against land owners/growers. Model Addicts Treatment and Rehabilitation Centre (MATRC) Quetta:

The Model Addicts Treatment and Rehabilitation Centre (MATRC) was established and on 30 June 2005. Patients' admission started on 18 Oct 2005. During year 2007, a total of 531 patients including relapse cases have been admitted and treated. Addicts admitted are given treatment and subsequently rehabilitated into the family, work place and society as productive citizens. MATRC Quetta has also coordinated with four NGOs and is using them as Out Reach Centres. In the fold of rehabilitation of addicts, it has already established stitching and washing units within the premises of MATRC.

Hajj Operation:

Every year, the Hajj operation is planned quite deliberately which comprises three main tasks i.e. preventive action (education of pilgrims), assertive action (physical check) and surveillance (a discrete over watch to pick up/identify any possible attempt to smuggle narcotics). During the year 2007, a total of 55 Hajj Flights originated from Quetta International Airport on which 10,762 pilgrims proceeded for Hajj. With the deployment of 43 officers/officials round the clock during Hajj Flight period, checking of these pilgrims and their belongings/baggage was done. By the Grace of Almighty Allah, RD ANF Quetta has proved its professionalism, worthiness and effectiveness, as no pilgrim proceeding from Quetta International Airport has been apprehended by Saudi authorities for carrying any narcotics substance.

Following awareness activities were undertaken:-

- Banners against drug abuse and trafficking were displayed at Hajji Camp and Hajj Terminal.
- Announcements were regularly made through public address system at Hajji Camp and Hajj
 Terminal warning the pilgrims about consequences of drug abuse and trafficking in Saudi
 Arabia.
- Stickers were printed with anti drug slogans and pasted on each piece of baggage.

Review Report



RD Rawalpindi

Like a number of other countries of the world, Pakistan is also a victim of the ever swelling drug threat. Pakistan's proximity to Afghanistan, which is acting as back office of drugs and narcotics in the region, is the main source of concern. The porous and volatile Pak-Afghan border, which is being crossed over by drug-laden gangsters, is multiplying the number of drug addicts in the country. In collaboration with the international community, the Government of Pakistan has intensified efforts to combat the menace of drug abuse and trafficking. Anti Narcotics Force (ANF) is the main instrument of the government in this regard. Regional Directorate ANF Rawalpindi is a potent segment of ANF which has heretofore seen a lot of success on the way of fighting the drug monster. It has been instrumental in gearing up anti-drug drive due to which public awareness on the subject is increasing manifold.

Major Seizures.

On January 30, , the staff of Police Station ANF Rawalpindi intercepted a passenger at Islamabad International Airport and recovered **4 kgs heroin** concealed in his suitcase. He was arrested on the spot.

On February I, on information the staff of Police Station-I ANF Rawalpindi in collaboration with Special Investigation Cell (SIC) intercepted a Canadian lady passenger at Islamabad International Airport and recovered **6 kgs heroin** concealed in specially made secret cavities in a cloth jacket packed in her travelling bag. She was arrested on the spot.



On March 2, on information, the staff of Police Station ANF Rawalpindi intercepted a passenger at Islamabad International Airport and recovered **4 kgs heroin** concealed in false cavities of 2 suitcases. He was arrested on the spot.

On March 13, on information the staff of Police Station-I ANF Rawalpindi laid a road block near Iqbal Shaheed Tool Plaza Attock. A Suzuki Mehran car coming from Peshawar was stopped. During search of the vehicle **5 kgs heroin** was recovered from the false cavities of the car. The accused driver was arrested on the spot.



On April 19, the staff of Police Station ANF Rawalpindi intercepted a passenger at Islamabad International Airport, recovered **7 kgs heroin** which was concealed in the false cavities of his suitcase and arrested him on the spot.

On April 29, on information the staff of Police Station-I ANF Rawalpindi intercepted a Honda City car near Harro Bridge. During search of the vehicle 330 kgs hashish, 132 kgs of hashish garda, I kg of opium and I kg of heroin were recovered. Four persons travelling in the same car were arrested.



On May 19, on information the staff of Police Station ANF Rawalpindi intercepted a Toyota Corolla 2.OD car at Tarnol railway crossing and recovered **162 kgs hashish** which was concealed in doors & under the driving seat of the same car. The accused driver of the car was arrested.

On May 20, on information the staff of Police Station ANF, Rawalpindi intercepted a Suzuki Baleno car at Tarnol railway crossing and recovered **126 kgs hashish and 4 kgs opium**, which were concealed in the door and under the seat of the car. Two accused persons travelling in the same car were arrested.

On July 9, on the receipt of information the staff of Police Station ANF, Rawalpindi conducted raid at Shaheen Cargo Islamabad International Airport and intercepted a person, recovered **52 kgs heroin** which was concealed in mango packs and arrested him on the spot. On his pointation three other members of the gang were also arrested.

On July 9, on information the staff of Police Station ANF Attock laid a road block at Jand road district Attock. A Toyota Hiace coming from Kohat was stopped. During search of the passengers 4 **kgs heroin** was recovered from the personal possession of three accused passengers who were arrested on the spot.

On July 13, on information the staff of Police Station ANF Attock laid a road block at GT Road Harro Bridge District Attock. A Pajero Jeep coming from Ghazi (NWFP) was stopped. During search of the Pajero Jeep 278 kgs hashish (garda), 92 kgs hashish, 4 kgs opium and a cache of arms and ammunition were recovered from the vehicle. One accused person was arrested on the spot.

On August 24, on information the staff of Police Station-I ANF Rawalpindi intercepted a Suzuki Carry Van near union council Burhan district Attock, recovered 24 kgs hashish garda from the vehicle and arrested three accused persons on the spot. On the pointation of an accused person, ANF staff conducted a raid at Punjab Hazara hotel situated at GT road near union council Burhan and recovered 0.280 kg hashish garda, 2 bottles wine and 8 kuppies liquor. Three other members of the gang were also nominated in the case.



On September 10, during the routine luggage checking, the staff of Police Station ANF Rawalpindi, intercepted a passenger at Islamabad international Airport and recovered **6 kgs heroin** which was concealed in the false cavities of 2 machines "Pearl Quick Kneader" placed in his suitcase. He was arrested on the spot.

On September 27, on information, the staff of Police Station ANF Rawalpindi in collaboration with Special Investigation Cell (SIC) intercepted a Toyota Corolla car at New Katarian Bridge Rawalpindi, recovered **55 kgs herion** which was concealed in two hand bags and arrested three persons on the spot. On the pointation of an arrested person a follow up raid was conducted at a house in Gujar Khan district Rawalpindi. An accused gang member, along with arms, ammunition and documents of property, was arrested from the house.

On October 2, on information, the staff of Police Station ANF Rawalpindi intercepted a Toyota Corolla car at Jharikas Haripur road and recovered **6 kgs heroin.** Four accused persons traveling in the same car were arrested on the spot.

On October 25, on information, the staff of Police Station-I ANF Rawalpindi in collaboration with SIC conducted a raid near Tarnol railway crossing Islamabad, intercepted four vehicles and recovered a total of **43 kgs of heroin.** Six accused persons were also arrested on the spot.



On October 25, on information the staff of Police Station ANF Attock laid a road block at GT road Harro bridge. A Suzuki van was intercepted after a chase. During search of the vehicle **115 kgs hashish, 106 kgs hashish garda and 2 kgs opium** concealed in the false cavities of the vehicle were recovered and three accused persons were arrested on the spot.

On November 26, on information, the staff of Police Station ANF Rawalpindi conducted a raid at H. No 544, G-9/4 Islamabad and recovered **7 kgs heroin** concealed in 22 bed sheets placed in the suitcase of a Nigerian woman. She was arrested on the spot.




On December 3, on information, the staff of Police Station ANF Attock conducted a raid near Khalid Saeed Hospital Road, Attock City and recovered **4 kgs heroin** from personal possession of an accused person who was arrested on the spot.

On December 12, on information, the staff of Police Station-1 ANF Rawalpindi, conducted a raid at street no. 9, I-10/2 Main Road Islamabad recovered 10 kgs heroin from an accused Nigerian national and arrested him on the spot.



Prosecutions

Strong and effective prosecution brings high rate of convictions. Regional Directorate ANF Rawalpindi vigorously pursued the drug cases. A large number of punishments were awarded to drug barons. Moreover, Regional Directorate ANF Rawalpindi also appealed in numerous cases in the High Court against the decisions of lower courts and sought exemplary punishments for the accused persons. The following tables present the state of prosecutions and punishments during 2007:



Assets Investigations

Probes and enquiries were conducted against the drug traffickers to estimate their assets derived through drugs proceeds. A number of enquiries are in progress. Whenever a drug baron in suspected to have accumulated assets through drug proceeds, he is booked under the provisions laid down in "Prevention of Smuggling Act 1977" or "Control of Narcotics Substances Act 1977". During the year 2007 the assets worth Rupees. 8954150/- in two cases were traced and frozen while five cases are under investigation.

Drug Demand Reduction Activities

Drug demand and consumption is on the increase in the country. Bearing the same fact in mind, Regional Directorate ANF Rawalpindi has always tried to reach the root cause of the problem. The Directorate organised various activities in collaboration with active segments of the society including NGOs, to inculcate healthy and positive habits in Pakistani youth.

Hajj Operation- 2007:

Hajj Operation was conducted at Hajj Complex Rawalpindi and Islamabad International Airport from 14 Nov 07 to 16 Dec 07. A total of 32164 pilgrims departed from Islamabad in 61 Pakistan International Airlines and 27 Saudi Arabian Airlines Flights. All underwent detailed and deliberate check/search by ANF staff, in collaboration with CAA, Customs, PIA and ASF. Necessary measures were taken at Hajj Complex as well as the Airport to prevent flow of narcotics to Kingdom of Saudi Arabia (KSA) through Hajj Flights. The effort bore fruit as not a single case of drug trafficking was reported at the destination airports i.e Jeddah and Madina. In addition to active search and scrutiny operations, passive measures such as distribution of pamphlets and leaflets etc amongst pilgrims were adopted in order to discourage narcotics trafficking through Hajj Flights. Messages against narcotics were regularly communicated through loud speakers and video screens installed in the Hajj Complex Rawalpindi.

Review Report SIC

The lucrative incentives, associated with the narco-trade are the major reason drug traffickers continue to operate, despite stringent laws that prescribe severe punishments including death penalty in many countries. The Special Investigation Cell (SIC) is well aware of the never-ending war against drugs, hence the struggle continues.

Interdiction of narcotic substances is becoming a complex affair, as drug gangs have gone extremely cautious, owing to successes achieved by Law Enforcement Agencies in recent years. The criminal groups have international linkages, which makes it quite cumbersome for the agencies to effectively fight off the drug trafficking activities of networks woven beyond the geographical limits of countries. Adopting new methodologies and innovation in drug trafficking, necessitates countering this menace beyond orthodox approach. Thus developing and learning new awareness / techniques is mandatory under prevalent circumstances.

The Special Investigation Cell (SIC) constantly engages itself in improving its expertise and developing the capacities of its functionaries to intervene the flow of drugs not only within the country but internationally as well. In neck to neck race with drug trafficking organizations, the department appears to be a step ahead. Its remarkable interdiction record over the years speaks clearly about its success.

Major Seizures.

On January 13, Special Investigation Cell (SIC) in collaboration with Regional Directorate ANF Peshawar, intercepted a motor car at Peshawar. Upon thorough search of the vehicle **473 kilograms of hashish and 8 kilograms of opium** were recovered from the specially made secret cavities in the car. The driver of the car was arrested.

On March 19, on information received for smuggling of heroin, from Islamabad to Gujrat, a team of Special Investigation Cell (SIC) was constituted in collaboration with the Regional Directorate ANF Lahore which led to the arrest of one person along with **30 kilograms of heroin.**

On May 16, Special Investigation Cell (SIC), assisted by the Regional Directorate ANF Peshawar, intercepted a car at Peshawar-Kohat Road and recovered 15 kilograms of heroin. The recovered drug was skillfully concealed under the rear seat of the car. One person was arrested on the spot.

On June 4, Special Investigation Cell (SIC), in conjunction with the Regional Directorate ANF Peshawar, intercepted a person at Peshawar International Airport. The accused was scheduled to fly by Qatar Airlines from Peshawar to Amsterdam via Doha, Qatar. Search of the accused person's luggage led to recovery of **8 kilograms of heroin**, tactfully concealed in a suitcase. The accused person was arrested on the spot.

On receiving information that drug traffickers intend to smuggle a shipment of hashish, purchased from Bara, Khyber Agency, the Special Investigation Cell (SIC) went on a high alert. Though it was a cumbersome task to locate the criminals but following the prevailing operational practices, effective ground checks were carried out and the individuals involved in drug trafficking were identified. On June 9, Special Investigation Cell (SIC), assisted by Police Station ANF, Sukkur conducted a raid and recovered 385 kilograms of hashish along with arrest of two persons, who were involved in drug business since long.

Special Investigation Cell (SIC), Quetta received information that a huge quantity of drugs would be transported through bus from Quetta to Turbat. Acting upon the information the bus was identified and a discreet surveillance was carried out. The persons transporting the drug, were also kept under constant observation. On July 18 the suspected bus moved from Quetta to Lakkh Pass for its final destination towards Turbat. The bus was intercepted and a thorough search led to the recovery of **298.000 kilograms of opium.** Two accused persons were arrested while the accused supplier went underground. The proclaimed offender was ultimately arrested on September 7 after a hectic effort.

On August 14, Special Investigation Cell (SIC), in collaboration with the Regional Directorate ANF Peshawar, intercepted a jeep and recovered **242 kilograms of hashish and 29 kilograms of opium.** The recovered drugs were skillfully concealed in the specially made secret cavities of the seized vehicle. Apart from the drugs 1 pistol (30 bore) with 2 magazines and 50 rounds were also recovered. Three persons traveling in the jeep were also arrested.

On September 27, Special Investigation Cell (SIC), in conjunction with the Regional Directorate ANF Rawalpindi, intercepted a motor car, bearing a fake registration number and recovered **55 kilograms of heroin.** Four accused persons traveling in the car were also arrested. It is worth mentioning that during this operation the organizer, carrier and mastermind were arrested. This racket had links in UK and Canada and the seized heroin was to be smuggled to these countries for distribution and sale.

On September 29, Special Investigation Cell (SIC), conducted a raid at Karachi, arrested four members of a racket and recovered I kilograms of heroin and 35 grams of cocaine. Simultaneously a raid was conducted in Lahore and the remaining three members of this gang, including a West African were arrested. It is noteworthy that in this operation, although the quantity of drugs seized was small but an entire drug gang, comprising the mastermind, organizer, carriers, distributors and foreign associates were arrested.

Special Investigation Cell (SIC), received information about a kingpin of a drug trafficking organization (DTO), reaching Islamabad for dispatch of **a huge quantity of drugs** to the United Kingdom. Mastermind / organizer of this racket had employed and engaged his trusted associates as facilitators. After the identification of the members of this gang a raid was conducted

On October 25 at a farm house, near Turnol, Islamabad, where an iron door was confiscated. This specially prepared iron door was cut and **43 kilograms fine quality heroin** was recovered from its cavities. The entire seven-member drug gang was arrested. During the course of investigation it was revealed that two Irish nationals visited Pakistan and advised the mastermind / organizer of this racket on the concealment method of drugs. It also transpired that the Irish people were member of a notorious armed gang back home and also had the responsibility of distribution / sale of the seized drugs in Ireland and UK.

Use of cocaine in Pakistan is on the rise. This drug, being very expensive, is used by affluent and elite class in the country. Special Investigation Cell (SIC), has not been oblivious of the situation and has tracked down many cocaine traffickers. Acting on information on March 8 Special Investigation Cell (SIC), in collaboration with the staff of Regional Directorate ANF Rawalpindi, conducted a raid and arrested two accused persons. Upon search of the accused I kilograms of cocaine was recovered from their possession.

Controlled Delivery Operations

Special Investigation Cell (SIC), in collaboration with the Law Enforcement Agencies of other countries targets high value traffickers, whenever an opportunity arises. The idea is to arrest the entire gang including mastermind / organizers of drug mafia.

A controlled delivery operation, theoretically speaking, is a pre-emptive measure to reduce drug smuggling. Special Investigation Cell (SIC), with its designed efforts has broken into networks of several drug cartels and nabbed many notorious traffickers.
